Marium Mukhtaar was a Pakistani Fighter pilot. She was born on 18 May 1992, in Karachi, with ancestral roots in Pano Akil, Sindh Pakistan. Marium's mother name is Rehana Mukhtaar. Her father's name is Dr. Mukhtaar Ahmed. She has two siblings Shahrukh Mukhtaar and Marvi Mukhtaar.

Marium Mukhtaar was the daughter of Colonel Ahmed Mukhtaar who settled in Karachi, as his hometown. She attended the Mehran Model School and College in Pano Akil, followed by the Army Public School and college in Malir Cantt, Karachi.

She played football for Baluchistan United in the National Women Football Championship. She studied civil engineering at NED University before qualifying as a fighter Pilot in the Pakistan Air Force in 2014, along with six other women. She was also involved in charity work, supporting a school for children who were unable to afford an education.

She joined the Pakistan Air Force on 6 MAY 2011 and graduated from the Air Force on 24 September 2014. She belonged to PAFS 132nd GD Pilot Course, which was attended by six other women. Marium trained as a fighter jet piolet at PAF Academy Bilaspur.

On 24 November 2015, Marium Mukhtaar, and squadron leader Saqib Abbasi were on a routine training mission when the FT-7PG crashed near Kundi an, Mainali Punjab. Both occupants ejected from the cockpit; Abbasi suffered minor injuries, but Marium Mukhtaar died of her injuries in a military hospital.

Marium Mukhtaar was among about 20 female fighter pilots in the Pakistan Air Force (PAF), which only began inducting women in combat roles in 2006.

It was not immediately clear why her aircraft crashed. The male pilot was not severely injured and is recovering in hospital.

Both the pilots handled the serious emergency with professionalism and courage and tried to save the ill-fated aircraft till the very last minute, a PAF statement said.

She died flying a Pakistan Air Force (PAF) FT-7PG aircraft that crashed near Kundi an in Mainali District, northwestern Punjab, Pakistan on 24, November 2015. Pakistans first female fighter pilot to die in the line of duty. Pakistan's military has suffered a series of air disasters in recent months. In September, a trainer jet crashed near Masting in Baluchistan province. The pilot was ejected to safety.

A military helicopter crash in May killed seven people, including the ambassadors of Norway and the Philippines. Another military helicopter crashed near Mn Sehra district in August., killing 12 people. The sixth death anniversary of female Pakistan's fighter pilot, flying officer, Marium Mukhtaar Shaheed was observed today to pay rich tributes for her sacrifice in the line duty and attained shahadat. Marium was the first female pilot of the Pakistan Air Force who scarified her life in the line of duty and attained shahadat.

Moreover, Marium Mukhtaar was honored with Tagma e Basalat on 23rdMarch 2016 by the government of Pakistan.

After she dead, she got an award (Tagma-e-Basalat).
